Canadian Aboriginal AIDS Network Contract Job Posting: Wellbeing Project Coordinator

The Canadian Aboriginal AIDS Network (CAAN) provides a National forum for Indigenous People to holistically address HIV and AIDS, HCV, STBBIs, TB, Mental health, and related co-morbidity issues; promotes a Social Determinants of Health framework through advocacy; and provides accurate and up to date resources on these issues in a culturally relevant manner for Indigenous Peoples wherever they reside.

Location: Flexible (Remote work available)

Employment type: Full-time contract until October 31, 2021.

Job Salary: \$30,000, depending on skills and experience.

Wellbeing Project Coordinator

The Wellbeing Project is a partnership initiative with the Dr. Peter's Centre. The coordinator will work in collaboration with a Research Assistant to identify and address gender-based violence (GBV) impact(s) on Indigenous people living with HIV/AIDS (IPHA) and Hepatitis C (HCV) (IPHC) in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic. This work will include Indigenous Womxn (anyone who self-identifies as a woman or girl, inclusive of cis Womxn, trans Womxn, two-spirit, femme/feminine-identifying, genderqueer, and non-binary), with a focus on the wholistic *wellbeing* of individuals and will support the voices of Indigenous womxn's contribution to addressing GBV amongst IPHA/IPHC during COVID-19.

Objectives:

1. Provide capacity-building training to womxn IPHA/IPHC – and those who serve them (policy makers, programmers, service providers, community organizations, etc.)
2. Develop resources grounded in Indigenous wise practices for GBV prevention/intervention work among IPHA/IPHC during COVID-19.

Key Activities: Capacity-building, resource development, training, and knowledge mobilization

1. Compile CAAN's existing GBV program and research findings into a discussion document.
2. Hold national dialogues in each of the 4 directions for Indigenous womxn to capture their perspectives on GBV prevention/intervention during COVID-19 and based on findings deliver community readiness training to build capacity for responding to GBV among IPHA/IPHC's.
3. Create GBV prevention/intervention resources specific to the needs of IPHA/IPHC's.
4. Host a Skills Building Virtual Summit on GBV.
5. Complete a final report inclusive of evaluation data releasing the project's results.



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Qualifications:

- Knowledge of Indigenous health and wellness.
- Knowledge of GBV and IPHA/IPHC living experience.
- Bachelor's Degree in social science or related field.
- Demonstrated related work experience.
